CANNABIS EDUCATION POSTCARDS



14% of 12th graders in Trumbull reported driving after using marijuana and **23% have ridden with a driver under the influence** in the past year.

DRIVING HIGH  **DRIVING DRUNK**

Driving after using marijuana is just as dangerous as driving drunk!



No matter how you use it, today's marijuana is **STRONGER THAN EVER!**



Frequent marijuana use damages the teenage brain, **CAUSING IQ LOSS.**

Regular use of marijuana impacts attention, memory, and concentration.



Many people think marijuana will calm their nerves, but high doses can cause **PANIC ATTACKS OR ACUTE PSYCHOSIS.**

Weekly or more frequent use of marijuana DOUBLES a teen's risk of having depression and anxiety.



CANNABIS EDUCATION – SOCIAL MEDIA



91% of Trumbull High teens report their parents disapprove of them using marijuana.



YOU CAN OVERDOSE ON MARIJUANA



An overdose is not deadly, but it is very unpleasant!
Edibles are easy to overdose on because the effects aren't felt immediately, leading people to eat more.



Regular use of marijuana impacts attention, memory, and concentration.



Frequent marijuana use interferes with brain development, which **CONTINUES UNTIL AGE 25.**



Trumbull High students care about their future, which is why most don't use marijuana.



Trumbull teens are making healthy choices to protect their mental health.

High potency marijuana use can cause:

- Anxiety
- Agitation
- Psychosis

Help keep our kids safe!
Use these free **Liquor Stickers** to seal up your unfinished bottles.

61% of Trumbull High students who drank alcohol reported they got it from home.

Place your Liquor Stickers over the bottle cap or cork and write the date when it was applied. If anyone under the age of 21 drinks on your property, the CT Social Host Law makes YOU liable. Please lock your liquor.

What is a Liquor Sticker?


Liquor Stickers are designed to prevent kids from accessing their parents' alcohol unnoticed.

Liquor Stickers are used by placing a sticker across the top of an unfinished bottle of wine, beer or liquor and writing the date you applied it.

Liquor Stickers are a great reminder to monitor the alcohol use in your household--your own or your kids'.

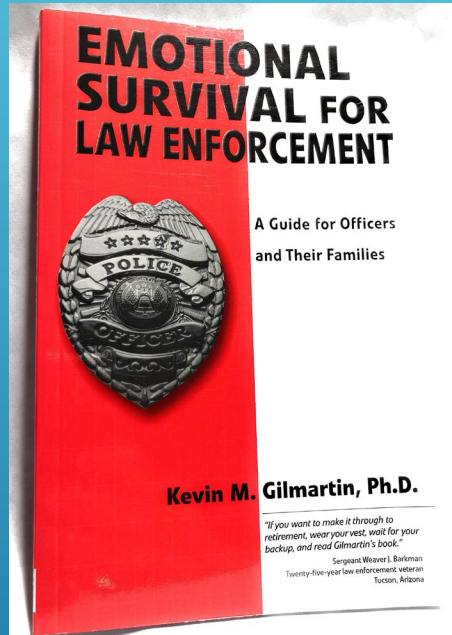

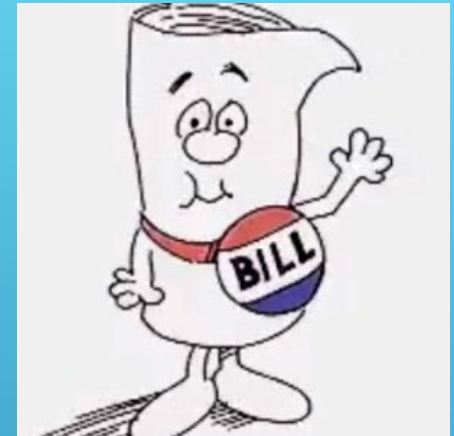
TPAUD has provided the TPAUD more than \$4,000 in screening tools, curricula, and materials for counselors (10/1-5/30)

POLICY EDUCATION



Commercialized Cannabis

- Additional 1-year Moratorium on Retail in Trumbull
- HB6699 requires health warnings, restricts synthetic cannabis, and further prohibits billboards
